

What is a Point-In-Time Count?

Thank you for considering assisting in the Point-In-Time Count. Below is a description from the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness of the Point-In-Time Count.



“Each year, HUD requires Continuums of Care (CoCs) to count the number of people experiencing homelessness in the geographic area that they serve through the Point-in-Time count (PIT). Conducted by most CoCs during the last ten days in January, the PIT count includes people served in shelter programs every year. In addition, every odd-numbered year, CoCs are responsible for counting people who are unsheltered, mobilizing staff and volunteers who canvas the streets and other settings to identify and enumerate people experiencing homelessness. Data collected during the PIT count is critical to effective planning and performance management toward the goal of ending homelessness for each community and for the nation as a whole. Counting those who are unsheltered ensures that many of the people with the highest needs are taken into account in community planning”.

The state of Missouri has elected to perform this count each year to get a better picture of the needs for people experiencing homelessness.
